


One Block + One Fabric Collection + One Layout = Your Next Quilt

Step 1: Open EQ8 and name your project.

- Select New Quilt
- Type Quilt Name in dialogue box
- Select OK




Step 2: Select a favorite block (or one you would like to work with) from the EQ library

......

- Select **Search for Block Patterns** on the **Home** screen.
- Locate a block you would like to feature in your quilt.
- Select Add to Sketchbook
- Close the library.

Step 3: Add a fabric collection (or a series of fabrics) from the EQ

library

- Select Search Fabric Swatches on the Home screen.
- Locate a fabric collection you would like to use in your quilt.
- Once you have located the collection, select Select all Fabrics followed by Add to Sketchbook. You can also select individual fabrics to add to the sketchbook as well.
- **Close** the library.



Step 4: Color your block

- View Project Sketchbook
- Select the Blocks tab. Locate the block added from Step 2 (it should be the last block in the sketchbook) and select Edit.
- Select the **Colo**r tab and **Fabric tools**.
- Use the Paintbrush and Spraycan to recolor your block.
- If you need more fabrics, repeat the exercise from Step 3 and add additional fabrics to your project. You can never have too much fabric!
- Use **Undo** to remove the last action(s).
- Add to Project Sketchbook.

Step 5: Decide how large you would like to make your quilt. Options include:


California King Wall
King Crib
Queen Miniature
Double – Full Tablerunner
Twin Placemats

Step 6: Select a layout for your quilt


- On the Home screen, select Design a Quilt from Scratch.
- Under the **New Quilt** tab, scroll to the end of the style ribbon and select Open Library.
- Pick from the various options depending on planned size of quilt or style of quilt.
- Add to Sketchbook.
- Close the library.



Step 7: Populate your quilt layout

- View Project Sketchbook.
- On the **Quilt** tab, select the layout selected during the Step 6. Select Edit.
- On the **Quilt Worktable** select the **Design** tab.
- Select **Block Tools** followed by **Set Block**.
- In the block palette, scroll to the end to find your block select during Step 2.
- If you have created multiple colorations of your block, select from the coloration options, and click on one of the block spaces in the guilt.
- Try using the **Command** (MAC) or **Ctrl** (PC) key on your keyboard when clicking on the block space. Notice how it fills multiple blocks. (This does not work on a Custom Set Layout.)



Step 8: Color the remainder of your quilt

- Select **Fabric tools** and the **Paintbrush** to color any additional spaces in the quilt.
- Using the Ctrl or Command key on your keyboard while clicking on a border or sashing space with the Paintbrush or Spraycan tools to speed up the coloring process.
- If you want to make sure you use a fabric that was used elsewhere in the quilt, use the Eyedropper tool to locate the fabric. Then select the Paintbrush and color any patches.
- If you make a mistake, the **Undo** tool can be useful to forget one or more recent steps.
- · Add to Project Sketchbook.
